

The historic 1825 Frazee House - one of the oldest brick houses in the Cuyahoga Valley - is located across road from the Ohio & Erie Canal, which was also being built at the same time. The Federal style house was restored with funds provided to TPL by a grant from the Cleveland Foundation. It is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

RICHFIELD COLISEUM

The one-time home of the Cleveland Cavaliers, Richfield Coliseum closed in 1994, and a mega-mall was proposed for the Coliseum's site. At the request of local citizen groups and community leaders, TPL acquired the property, demolished the vacant arena, and transferred ownership to the Cuyahoga Valley National Park. The land has returned to its natural state, and TPL's conservation of the land eased the imminent threat of sprawl.

BLOSSOM MUSIC CENTER

Owned and managed by the Cleveland Orchestra and its governing organization, the Musical Arts Association (MAA), Blossom Music Center's 780 acres sit entirely within the National Park. Looking for conservation and fundraising opportunities, MAA sought TPL's help in 2007 with selling the majority of its property to the National Park Service. TPL has protected 580 acres in two purchases, connecting more than 5,000 acres of forested ecosystems.

In 1978 The Trust for Public Land began conserving lands for Cuyahoga Valley National Park. Over three decades, TPL has completed 24 acquisitions for the park - from single lots to small farms to historic inns and businesses - protecting 2,103 acres with a fair market value of \$18,457,780.
